## What type of harness should I choose?

## Biothane vs Leather or Nylon

Getting set up to drive your horse can be expensive so many people are looking for a way to cut costs and corners. But let me tell you, when you and your horse's safety is at stake, buying cheap equipment is not the way to go.

There are many inexpensive nylon or synthetic leather harness for sale on ebay and other online selling sites for a fraction of the cost of a good BioThane or leather harness. A new good quality, long lasting, safe harness is going to more-than-likely cost \$500 or more, but is an investment worth making in terms of comfort, durability and safety.

Let's look at some of the pros and cons of the top 3 harness materials.

The bottom line is that I strongly caution people against buying nylon or synthetic leather harness. They are not comfortable for you or your horse. They do not hold up well under frequent use. They stain and fade easily and they are frequently made with inferior hardware that can be a safety hazard. Do you and your horse a favor, buy a quality harness that will last a lifetime. Also, BioThane belting is made here in the USA. Look for the BioThane tag on your next purchase. A brown BioThane tag means you are keeping Americans working.
